Word Learning Strategy: Precise and Flexible

Synonyms are words having the same meaning but the intensity of the word varies.

The term used in the MS-CCRS for the intensity of those words is "shades of meaning".

Shades of meaning is used interchangeably with the term "nuanced meaning".

Example:

warm, hot, boiling, and sweltering

These words are all used to describe the temperature of a noun. Each of these words have a precise definition usage, though they all are related to a higher degree of temperature.

Sometimes we hear people use these words to describe something that does not deal with temperature.

Example:

"I was boiling mad."

The use of a word in a way different from its precise meaning is called **"flexible"** usage.

Vocabulary word is massive.
