


Explicitly Teach Morphology

1. Introduce the concept of studying “word parts”.
2. Discuss the benefits of being familiar with “word parts”, such as better spelling, faster reading, and deeper understanding.
3. Introduce basic morphological terms.
4. Teach each affix individually and explicitly.
5. Ask questions about what the new word means within its new form.
6. Practice analyzing words with previously taught and current morphemes.



Inflectional Suffix Example
-ed
“happened in the past”

walk
play
rain
laugh
sleep
name
cheat

Ask questions such as:

- What does it mean when we add -ed to _____?
- What are the two word parts in the word. _____?
- Discuss various sounds of the affix at the end and why.

Phonological Awareness could be practiced as well.
